**ENERGY CAPITAL JUNIOR RODEO RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

1. By entering all contestants agree to abide by and follow all rules. Energy Capital Junior Rodeo reserves the right to refuse entry to any horse or individual.
2. Contestant can enter 2 times in each event only first entry will count for all around or buckles
3. Entry payments must be postmarked by July 29 2022. Entries postmarked Phone in entries paid via venmo or (Credit Card 5% fee ) due by Aug 5<sup>th</sup> 2022. Entries will be taken up until one hour before start of rodeo on Friday. Entries taken on Friday will be charged a \$75 late fee, and must be cash, credit card or money order. (All late fees are retained by Energy Capital Junior Rodeo)
4. Format will be two go-rounds and average. The first round will be drawn, the second round will be run in reverse order. Top 15 will come back to the short go. In the short go barrel and poles will run in a random draw order, all other events will run from slowest to fastest time.
5. The division of the purse will be 100% any added money 80% of the \$200 entry fee will be jackpotted the remainder is stock charge is Jr and Divisions  
25% to the first go-round  
25% to the second go-round  
20% Short Go  
30% to the average  
10U and 12U events will be one run jackpot will be 50% after stock charge
6. Full Dress code – Long sleeve shirt, boots and cowboy hat or helmet are to be worn during all competition.
7. Barrels and Poles - Timers- Two electric timers will be used. Reruns will be given only in the event of a timer malfunction. If a rerun is given, it will be up to the show manager to decide when the rerun will take place. Reruns will not be given for horses falling, contestant equipment breaking or for a rider's decision to pull up.
8. PAYMENTS All fees must be paid in US funds. No refunds in any event.
9. W-9 No checks will be issued until a W9 is provided. These will be available at the rodeo office.
10. Age group will be determined on the age of the contestant as of Jan 1<sup>st</sup> 2022.
11. Zero Tolerance Policy Abuse includes but not limited to excessive jerking, spurring, whipping, slapping, abuse with a device or any other act intended to cause trauma or injury to a horse. In arena, practice pen, or on rodeo grounds. Any accusations of abuse will be reviewed by rodeo committee. Abusers will be asked to leave rodeo grounds forfeiting any and all fees or winnings.
12. All other rules and regulations will be the same as the National High School Rodeo Association rule book.
